Agenda Item 2. A Public Hearing of the Springfield City Council was opened at 7:10 p.m. to consider the following items a through c associated with the applications filed by DAMMM Land, LLC, applicant, and RTR Development, LLC, owner, requesting the following items (a thru c) all on property legally described as the North ½ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 23, Township 13 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska; and generally located on the southwest corner of Hwy 50 and Platteview Road: (a) Amendment to the City of Springfield's Comprehensive Plan changing the future land use designation from Highway Commercial and Business Park to Highway Commercial and Industrial; (b) Zone Change from Agricultural Residential to Business Highway and Light Industrial; and (c) Preliminary Plat (Lots 1-6 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce). Council reviewed the staff report and comments provided by city professional staff. No one from the public spoke in favor of or in opposition to the application. Motion by Swenson, seconded by Murtha, to close the public hearing. AYES: Swenson, Herzog, Murtha. NAYS: None. ABSENT: Craney. Motion carried. Public hearing ended at 7:13 p.m.

Agenda Item 3. Council Member Swenson introduced Ordinance No. 1027 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION FROM HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL AND BUSINESS PARK TO HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL ON LOTS 2 AND 3 AND OUTLOTS A AND B, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, AND INDUSTRIAL ON LOTS 1, 4, 5 AND 6, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, SAID PROPERTY LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS THE NORTH ½ OF THE NORTHEAST ¼ OF SECTION 2, TOWNSHIP 13 NORTH, RANGE 11 EAST OF THE 6TH P.M., SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND GENERALLY LOCATED ON THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF HIGHWAY 50 AND PLATTEVIEW ROAD; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF

and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Council Member Murtha seconded the motion to suspend the rules and upon roll call vote on the motion the following Council Members voted AYE: Swenson, Herzog, Murtha. The following voted NAY: None. The

following were ABSENT: Craney. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted by three-fourths of the Council and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance. Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Council Member Swenson moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Council Member Murtha. The Mayor then stated the question "Shall Ordinance No. 1027 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted AYE: Swenson, Herzog, Murtha. The following voted NAY: None. The following were ABSENT: Craney. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor in the presence of the Same and affixed her signature thereto and ordered the ordinance to be published or posted as required by law and as provided therein. A true, correct and complete copy of said ordinance is as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 1027

AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION FROM HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL AND BUSINESS PARK TO HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL ON LOTS 2 AND 3 AND OUTLOTS A AND B, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, AND INDUSTRIAL ON LOTS 1, 4, 5 AND 6, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, SAID PROPERTY LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS THE NORTH ½ OF THE NORTHEAST ¼ OF SECTION 2, TOWNSHIP 13 NORTH, RANGE 11 EAST OF THE 6TH P.M., SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND GENERALLY LOCATED ON THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF HIGHWAY 50 AND PLATTEVIEW ROAD; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. APPLICATION. An application was filed by DAMMM Land, LLC, applicant, and RTR Development, LLC, owner, requesting a change of future land use designation from Highway Commercial and Business Park to Highway Commercial on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, said property legally described as the North ½ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 23, Township 13 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska; and generally located on the southwest corner of Highway 50 and Platteview Road.

Section 2. APPROVAL TO CHANGE FUTURE LAND USE DESIGNATION FROM HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL AND BUSINESS PARK TO HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL ON LOTS 2 AND 3 AND OUTLOTS A AND B, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, AND INDUSTRIAL ON LOTS 1, 4, 5 AND 6, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE. On April 14, 2020, the Springfield Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on the matter of changing the future land use designation from Highway Commercial and Business Park to Highway Commercial on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, and reported to the City Council that it recommended approval of the land use change. On May 5, 2020, the City Council opened a public hearing on said proposed changes and found and determined that the future land use change from Highway Commercial and Business Park to Highway Commercial on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, was advisable. The City Council further found and determined that public hearings were duly held and notices were duly given. The City Council hereby approves said proposed change in future land use designation from Highway Commercial and Business Park to Highway Commercial on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, was advisable. The City Council hereby approves said proposed change in future land use designation from Highway Commercial and Business Park to Highway Commercial on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, contingent upon the final plat for Springfield Commerce being recorded with the Sarpy County Register of Deeds and the applicant closing on the real estate transaction with property owner.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Council Member Murtha seconded the motion to suspend the rules and upon roll call vote on the motion the following Council Members voted AYE: Swenson, Murtha. The following voted NAY: Herzog. The following were ABSENT: Craney. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted by three-fourths of the Council and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance. Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Council Member Swenson moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Council Member Murtha. The Mayor then stated the question "Shall Ordinance No. 1028 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted AYE: Swenson, Murtha. The following voted NAY: Herzog. The following were ABSENT: Craney. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor in the presence of the Council signed and approved the ordinance and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto and ordered the ordinance to be published or posted as required by law and as provided therein. ORDINANCE NO. 1028

AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION FROM AGRICULTURE RESIDENTIAL TO BUSINESS HIGHWAY ON LOTS 2 AND 3 AND OUTLOTS A AND B, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, AND LIGHT INDUSTRIAL ON LOTS 1, 4, 5 AND 6, SPRINGFIELD COMMERCE, SAID PROPERTY LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS THE NORTH ½ OF THE NORTHEAST ¼ OF SECTION 23, TOWNSHIP 13 NORTH, RANGE 11 EAST OF THE 6TH P.M., SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND GENERALLY LOCATED ON THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF HIGHWAY 50 AND PLATTEVIEW ROAD; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. APPLICATION. An application was filed by DAMMM Land, LLC, applicant, and RTR Development, LLC, owner, requesting a change of zoning classification from Agriculture Residential to Business Highway on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Light Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, said property legally described as the North ½ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 23, Township 13 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska; and generally located on the southwest corner of Highway 50 and Platteview Road.

Section 2. APPROVAL TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION. On April 14, 2020, the Springfield Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on the matter of changing the zoning classification from Agriculture Residential to Business Highway on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Light Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, said property legally described as the North ½ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 23, Township 13 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska, and generally located on the southwest corner of Highway 50 and Platteview Road, and reported to the City Council that it recommended approval of the zoning classification change, subject to identified conditions. On May 5, 2020, the City Council held a public hearing on said proposed change and found and determined that the zoning classification change from Agriculture Residential to Business Highway on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Light Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce was advisable and in conformance with the comprehensive plan. The City Council further found and determined that public hearings were duly held and notices were duly given. The City Council hereby approves said proposed change of zoning classification from Agriculture Residential to Business Highway on Lots 2 and 3 and Outlots A and B, Springfield Commerce, and Light Industrial on Lots 1, 4, 5 and 6, Springfield Commerce, contingent upon the final plat being recorded with the Sarpy County Register of Deeds and the applicant closing on the real estate transaction with property owner and subject to identified conditions as follows:

- 1. Rezoning shall include a Highway Corridor Overlay Designation as shown on the current zoning map.
- 2. Development on the rezoned property will be subject to the design guidelines of the Highway Corridor Overlay District.
- 3. Property shall be platted prior to issuance of a building permit.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Agenda Item 6. Chris Pitschmann, 800 Maple Street, informed the Council that he has observed vehicles not stopping at the three-way intersection of 8th Avenue and Maple Street. He is concerned with the amount of children in the neighborhood, crossing streets, that a child will think a car will stop at the stop sign but the car will not stop and the child will get hit. He noted that vehicles are stopping at the stop sign on 8th Avenue as cars come up to Maple Street. The largest offenders are those that live in the neighborhood. Kent Maystrick, Street Commissioner, recommended the city leave the three-way stop as is for safety reasons. He is concerned that Maple Street will become a speed way through the neighborhood. Swenson asked staff to contact the sheriff's department to increase enforcement in the area. Flags will also be placed on the stop signs for visibility. City staff will see if anything else can be done to improve vehicles stopping at this intersection.

Agenda Item 4. No Department Report from Craney.

Agenda Item 5. Mayor Roseland reported that he is participating in weekly conference calls with the Governor.

Agenda Item 6. Kathleen Gottsch, City Administrator, informed the Council about the proposed senior cruise and fireworks event on May 13. Council determined that the fireworks would not be permitted at the Sarpy County Fairgrounds due to local health regulations and enforcement issues with social distancing. Gottsch will inform the organizers that fireworks are not permitted at the fairgrounds. She will also advise that no streets will be closed for the "cruise." The group will have to follow social

distancing requirements and residents cannot congregate along the street as they would typically for a parade.
