Agenda Item 1. Lt. Wrigley with the Sarpy County Sheriff's Department reviewed the Monthly Service Report. Lt. Wrigley reported the Sherriff's Department is getting ready to roll out a few new themed cruisers. One will sport an American flag, and rumor has it in October the themed cruisers will be Breast Cancer Awareness. Murtha asked if there had been an uptick in human trafficking around the area. Lt. Wrigley is not aware of an increase at this time. Lt. Wrigley noted the group home has been pretty quiet lately due to a decrease in residents.

Agenda Item 2. Kellie Seiber, Springfield Memorial Library Director, reviewed their Summer Reading Program Report. This year's theme was Adventure. All of their programs were super successful this summer. Minutes read by kids had an increase of 42% from 56,000 minutes to 81,000 minutes. They had three more adult programs than in past years and all of them had higher attendance. Teen activity attendance went up this year also. Teens worked on a bucket list project. Thirty-one of these were returned. There were 4,464 books checked out during the summer. Seiber and library staff were very pleased with program participation this summer.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, NEBRASKA, AMENDING SPRINGFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 9 BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE 2 BUILDING CODE, SECTION 9-201 BUILDING CODE; ADOPTED BY REFERENCE; TO HARMONIZE WITH STATE LAW; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS; AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE

and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Council Member Neitzel seconded the motion to suspend the rules and upon roll call vote on the motion the following Council Members voted AYE: Neitzel, Herzog, Craney. The following voted NAY: None. The following were ABSENT: Mayor Roseland. Council President Murtha presided as Mayor. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted by three-fourths of the Council and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance. Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Council Member Herzog moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Council Member Neitzel. ORDINANCE NO. 1153

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, NEBRASKA, AMENDING SPRINGFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 9 BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE 2 BUILDING CODE, SECTION 9-201 BUILDING CODE; ADOPTED BY REFERENCE; TO HARMONIZE WITH STATE LAW; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS; AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. Chapter 9, Article 2, Section 9-201 of the Municipal Code of Springfield, Nebraska is amended to read as follows:

§9-201 BUILDING CODE; ADOPTED BY REFERENCE. To provide certain minimum standards, provisions, and requirements for safe and stable design, methods of construction, and uses of materials in buildings hereafter erected, constructed, enlarged, altered, repaired, relocated, and converted, the 2012-2018 International Building Code, as issued by the International Code Council and amended by Exhibit A, the 2012-2018 International Residential Code, as issued by the International Code Council and amended by Exhibit B, the 2012–2018 International Mechanical Code, as issued by the International Code Council, the 2012-2018 International Fuel Gas Code, as issued by the International Code Council, the 2012-2018 International Plumbing Code, as issued by the International Code Council, the 2009–2018 International Energy Conservation Code, as issued by the International Code Council, the 2014-2023 National Electric Code, as issued by the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., and the 2009 International ANSI A117.1 Assessable and Useable Buildings and Facilities Codeand the Building Code Amendments, Deletions and Changes as shown in Exhibits A and B to Ordinance 942, passed 2/7/17, and printed in book or pamphlet form is hereby incorporated by reference in addition to all amended editions as though printed in full herein insofar as said Codes do not conflict with the Statutes of the State of Nebraska. Three (3) copiesA copy of said Codes are-is on file at the office of the Municipal Clerk and are-is available for public inspection at any reasonable time. The provisions of said Codes shall be controlling throughout the Municipality and throughout its zoning jurisdiction. (Ref. 17-1001, 18-132, 19-902, 19-922 RS Neb.) (Amended by Ord. Nos. 298, 3/1/88; 374, 3/21/95; 594, 1/21/03; 674, 6/21/06; 709, 3/7/06; 796, 10/4/11; 861, 8/5/14; 942, 2/7/17)

Section 2. Any other ordinance or code section passed and approved prior to passage, approval, and publication or posting of this ordinance and in conflict with its provisions is repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication or posting as required by law.

EXHIBIT A AMENDMENTS TO THE 2018 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE (IBC)

Portions of standard codes and additional requirements, rules and regulations specified below are hereby adopted as the Building Code of Sarpy County, Nebraska for regulating the erection, construction, enlargement, alteration, repair, moving, removal, demolition, conversion, occupancy, equipment, use, height, area and maintenance of all buildings or structures within the jurisdiction of Sarpy County and providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor. Provisions of the standard codes and additional requirements, rules and regulations adopted herein shall be applied, interpreted and construed together and consistently to the extent possible. Unless otherwise indicated by context or otherwise, references to any table, section or subsection shall mean the corresponding provision of the relevant standard code.

Section 105.2 Work Exempt from a permit.

Change Item #1 Change 120 to 79 square feet. *Delete* Item #6 Delete entirely sidewalks & driveways

Section 903 Automatic Sprinkler Systems

Add **903.2.1.8** Any Group "A" Occupancies with Alcoholic Beverages. An automatic sprinkler system shall be installed throughout the building with any Group "A" exceeding 1000 square feet and where there is liquor, wine, or beer license issued and /or where the occupants consume alcoholic beverages.

Section 1503 Weather Protection

Add **1503.6 Rain Water**. Rain water shall be discharged at least three (3) feet away from the building foundation in a direction parallel to the adjoining property line when the discharge point is within twenty (20) feet of the adjoining property line. Exception: Structures with no sub-grade.

Section 16 Structural Design

Add **1601.2 Criteria.** The climate and geographical design criteria for building construction in Sarpy County Nebraska shall be: **1**-Ground/snow load 30 lbs psf. **2**-Wind speed 115 MPH for a 3 second gust with exposure "C", **3**-Seismic Design Category "B". **4**-Weathering probability for concrete - Severe. **5**-Frost line depth 42 inches. **6**- Termites, Moderate to heavy. **7**-Decay, slight to moderate. **8**-Winter design temperature, minus 5 degrees.

Section 18 Excavation, Grading and Fill

Add **1804.4 Collapsible Soils.** Portion of the Omaha Metro area are underlain by low unit weight soils that can collapse when saturated. Additional studies shall be made to evaluate the presence and extent of the collapsible soils and to assess the effects of any collapsible soils identified at the site on the performance of the structure

Section 23 Trusses

Add **2303.4.1.2.1 Markings.** Each truss shall be legibly branded, marked, or otherwise have permanently affixed thereto the following information located within 2 feet of the center of the span on the face of the bottom chord; **1**- Identify the company manufacturing the truss. **2**- The design load. **3**- The spacing of the truss.

Section 407 Columns

Add **407.3.1 Vertical support requirements for decks and porches**. Vertical supports for decks and porches shall be wood posts of not less than six inches by six inches in dimension. Underlying footings shall meet the foundation specifications of adopted IBC provisions.

The provisions of the <u>2012–2018</u> International Plumbing Code, as issued by the International Code Council, shall be controlling throughout the Municipality and throughout its zoning jurisdiction. All prior ordinances in conflict herewith shall be and are hereby repealed. <u>Three (3) copiesA copy</u> of the National Electric Code <u>are is</u> on file at the office of the Municipal Clerk and are available for public

inspection at any reasonable time. The provisions of the National Electric Code 2017–2023 Edition shall be controlling throughout the Municipality and throughout its zoning jurisdiction. (*Ref. 17-1001, 18-132, 19-902, 19-922 RS Neb.*) (*Amended by Ord. No. 375, 3/21/95; 862, 8/5/14; 973, 4/17/18*).

Section 2. Any other ordinance or code section passed and approved prior to passage, approval, and publication or posting of this ordinance and in conflict with its provisions is repealed.

Agenda Item 7. Kathleen Gottsch, City Administrator, reported that revised plans for the building design on Raven Northbrook's new data center building have been submitted and are acceptable to city staff. Motion by Neitzel, seconded by Herzog, to approve the Highway Corridor Overlay District Design Review for Raven Northbrook's revised application for a data center building (SNB 5, 6 and C) on Part of Lot 1, Gemini Replat One, generally located at 13805 Silicon Prairie Plaza. AYES: Neitzel, Herzog, Craney. NAYS: None. Absent: Mayor Roseland, Murtha presided as Mayor. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 8. Gottsch reported that AM Contracting's proposed commercial building at 14845 Rodina Street depicts a two-foot-wide neon green stripe along the warehouse portion of the building's façade. Neon green is one of AM Contracting's branding colors and they want the building to be recognizable to their clients. The color palette for this district requires colors to be earth tones. Additional landscaping is also required per the CO District regulations. Motion by Neitzel, seconded by Craney, to approve the corridor overlay district design review for AM Contracting upon them revising all outstanding issues. AYES: Neitzel, Craney. NAYS: None. Abstain: Herzog. Absent: Mayor Roseland, Murtha presided as Mayor. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 9. Gottsch stated that Kathy Cooper, 465 Chestnut Street, requested the city remove the bushes in the grass alley that runs behind her property so a tree trimming company can access the back of her property to remove a dead tree in her backyard. Gottsch provided the Council with a signed paper from all but one adjacent property owner stating that they were okay with the removal of the bushes. Neitzel stated that he is the one property owner that has not given his consent because he has taken care of the bushes for years and his sprinkler system is very close to the back of his property. His concern is the equipment that will be coming down the alley will cross over onto his property, and it will cause ruts in his yard and damage his sprinkler heads. He would rather they access the tree through Cooper's side yard.

Murtha stated that she had a tree removed recently and her contractor used a piece of equipment that fit through her gate to access her backyard. Craney stated that ideally if there was a smaller piece of equipment that could access her backyard it would work the best, but she does have the right to use the alley to have the work done. Neitzel agreed but said that he is not giving her permission to drive through and damage his property in order to access hers. Cooper has been in contact with all the other surrounding neighbors and none of them had an issue with her using the alley, but Neitzel pointed out that nobody else would be affected like he would be either. Craney will reach out to Cooper and get more information on her project and get back with Council on his findings. Motion by Herzog, seconded by Craney, to table agenda item 9, regarding a request to remove bushes located within the city right-of-way (old alley) east of North 4th Street between Elm Street and Chestnut Street, until more information is gathered. AYES: Herzog, Craney. NAYS: Neitzel. Absent: Mayor Roseland, Murtha presided as Mayor. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 10. Gottsch reported that the city received a request to allow a family to sponsor a disc golf hole in honor of their loved one who is retiring from the workforce. Gottsch asked Council for guidance on how to manage requests for sponsorships like this now and in the future as we have a lot of residents that have requested to add memorial benches, trees and other items over the past few years. After much discussion, it was decided to do more research on sponsorships and discuss it further at a later date.

Agenda Item 11. Gottsch stated that a large amount of contingency money that was requested in our NDEE loan for the new well project is still available for the city to use on a water related project. We used a portion of the contingency funds to increase the size of the pump in the new well. If we don't use the funds, they will go back, and our loan balance will be lowered. The loan includes 20% loan forgiveness and low interest, so it would be good if we have a water project that we can plan for with the remainder of the funds. Neitzel questioned using the funds to add water resources to the recently acquired soccer complex. Gottsch agreed that would be a good use of the funds. She also stated we need to start thinking about a new water tower to handle more capacity in 3-5 years. After discussing ideas for the funds, staff will research further into the suggestions that were mentioned.

Agenda Item 12. Motion by Herzog, seconded by Neitzel, to approve a 4% merit increase to Kellie Seiber, Library Director. AYES: Neitzel, Herzog, Craney. NAYS: None Absent: Mayor Roseland, Murtha presided as Mayor. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 13. Motion by Herzog, seconded by Neitzel, to move agenda item 13, after department reports. AYES: Neitzel, Herzog, Craney. NAYS: None. Absent: Mayor Roseland, Murtha presided as Mayor. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 1. Neitzel reported Heath Shemek, Water/Sewer Operator, stated the maintenance department is nearing the end of residential pot holing and will begin commercial

properties soon. Shemek delivered two new water meters to the fairgrounds. Nietzel questioned if there has been any further discussion on an indoor pickle ball court. This item will be discussed as part of the budget.

Agenda Item 2. No department report from Herzog.

Agenda Item 3. Murtha reported that Tyler Holdorf, Parks Director, said the splash pad has been left on because of the nice weather. Holdorf has been helping with the pot holing project. Holdorf will be assessing dead trees at Springfield Creek Trails & Recreation Area and the Library.

Agenda Item 4. Craney reported that Bryan Cherry, Street Superintendent, started three areas of street repairs. Cherry is working up a plan for sidewalk replacement on downtown Main Street for the best way to leave access so patrons can reach their destination. Cherry has also been helping with the pot holing.

Agenda Item 5. No department report from Mayor Roseland.
